ANDREW BOVELL's (Playwright) works for the stage include Things I Know To Be True, a co-production between State Theatre Company of South Australia and Frantic Assembly in the UK (2016); an adaptation of Kate Grenville's novel The Secret River, directed by Neil Armfield, Sydney Theatre Company / Sydney Festival 2013; When the Rain Stops Falling, Adelaide Festival of the Arts 2008. The play was produced in London at the Almeida Theatre (2009) and in New York (2010) where it won five Lucille Lortell Awards and was named best new play of the year by Time Magazine. Productions of Andrew's plays continue to be performed throughout Asia, UK, America and Europe. Other plays include El Jardin, Song of First Desire, Anthem, Holy Day, Who's Afraid of the Working Class?, Speaking in Tongues, Scenes from a Separation, Ship of Fools, and After Dinner. Andrew's film credits include In the Shadow of Iris; A Most Wanted Man, an adaptation of John Le Carre's novel for director Anton Corbijn (starring Phillip Seymour Hoffman, Rachel McAdams, Willem Defoe and Robyn Wright) which premiered at Sundance Film Festival: Edge of Darkness starring Mel Gibson; Blessed; The Book of Revelation; Lantana, based on his stage play Speaking in Tongues, premiered at Sydney Film Festival and had Gala Screening at Toronto Film Festival, screenplay was awarded, Best Screenplay at the Australian Film Institute Awards, Australian Critics Circle Writers Guild Award; Head On, Australian Fisherman's Wake and the original screenplay for Strictly Ballroom. He has films in development with Tessa Ross (UK) and Blumhouse (US) and mini-series in development with See-Saw Films and Curio Pictures.

CINDY BATES (Director) has directed over 20 shows with CCT including Misery, Broadway Bound, Arsenic and Old Lace, The Odd Couple, Harvey, and Rabbit Hole. She is a professor of theatre and department chair at SUNY Empire State University. She graduated from the Yale Drama School with a DFA and MFA in Dramaturgy and Dramatic Criticism and an MA in Performance Studies from Tisch School of the Arts, NYU. Cindy is the recipient of the SUNY Empire Excellence in Mentoring Award, the Susan H. Turben Chair in Mentoring, and the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Teaching.
