

FREDERICK KNOTT (Playwright) was born on August 28, 1916, in China to an English missionary family. Knott earned a law degree from Cambridge University after attending Oundle School and served in the British Army from 1939 to 1946, achieving the rank of major. Knott only wrote three plays during his lifetime, yet his spine-tingling thrillers ran successfully on Broadway in the 1950s and 1960s, and have been standards in regional theatre and touring productions throughout the world. His most famous script, DIAL M FOR MURDER, is about a man who plots the murder of his wealthy wife but has to improvise once she staves off his plan, and was rejected several times before playing successfully on British television in the early 1950s. It then hit the London stage to rave reviews. In 1952 the play opened on Broadway, and in 1954 was adapted by Knott into a film directed by Alfred Hitchcock, starring Grace Kelly and Ray Milland. His second most popular play, WAIT UNTIL DARK, ran for 374 performances on Broadway in 1966 and earned actress Lee Remick a Tony Award nomination for her portrayal of a blind woman terrorized by thugs. In 1967 the play was made into a popular film of the same name starring Alan Arkin and Audrey Hepburn. It was revived on Broadway in 1998 in a production starring Marisa Tomei and Quentin Tarantino. His third play, WRITE ME A MURDER, opened on Broadway in 1961 and ran for twenty-five weeks. Fredrick Knott passed away in 2002.

JEFFREY HATCHER (Adaptation) is an award-winning writer for stage, screen, and television. Born in Steubenville, Ohio, he graduated from Denison in 1980 with a degree in Theater and Cinema. After moving to New York and attending (briefly) New York University's Graduate Acting Program, he shifted from performing to writing. Since then, dozens of Hatcher's plays, original and adaptations, have been produced on Broadway. Off-Broadway, and in theaters around the world. They include -Broadway: Never Gonna Dance (Book). Off-Broadway: Three Viewings and A Picasso at Manhattan Theatre Club; Scotland Road and The Turn of the Screw at Primary Stages; Tuesdays with Morrie (with Mitch Albom) at The Minetta Lane; Murder By Poe, The Turn of the Screw and The Spy at The Acting Company; Neddy at American Place; and Fellow Travelers at Manhattan Punchline. Other Plays/Theaters: Compleat Female Stage Beauty, Mrs. Mannerly, Murderers, Mercy of a Storm, Smash, Armadale, Korczak's Children, To Fool the Eye, The Falls, A Piece of the Rope, All the Way with LBJ, The Government Inspector, Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde and others at The Guthrie, Old Globe, Yale Rep, The Geffen, Seattle Rep, Cincinnati Playhouse, Alabama Shakespeare Festival, Milwaukee Rep., Repertory Theater of St. Louis, Actors Theater of Louisville, Philadelphia Theater Company, Asolo, City Theater, Studio Arena and many more in the U.S. and abroad. Film/ TV: Stage Beauty, Casanova, The Duchess, and episodes of Columbo. Grants/Awards: NEA, TCG, Lila Wallace Fund, Rosenthal New Play Prize, Frankel Award, Charles MacArthur Fellowship Award, McKnight Foundation, Jerome Foundation and Barrymore Award Best New Play. He is a member and/or alumnus of The Playwrights Center, the Dramatists Guild, the Writers Guild and New Dramatists.

STEVE FLETCHER (Director) has directed over 50 shows with CCT and acted in four. Other acting credits include nine years as the notorious Brad Vernon on ABC's daytime drama "One Life To Live". Steve can also be seen in the films Dorian Blues and The Skeptic. Regional Theatre credits include Kingdom Of The Shore, Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, Biloxi Blues, The Threepenny Opera and One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest. He earned a BFA and MFA from the Goodman School of Drama in Chicago and was a founding member of the Wisdom Bridge Theater Company and Free Street Theater Company.

JJ BUECHNER (Mike) was last seen at CCT in Popcorn Falls (Joe and others). Favorite roles include Tiny Houses (Jeremiah), Spring Awakening (Adult Male), P-town (Rusty), Chasing Charles (Dennis), Strong St. (Bernie), Choices (Ethan), The Guys (Nick), Church and State (Sen. 
